Artist Biography

As a plein air artist, Michelle Lavallée witnesses the scene as she paints it on location. The luminosity and color of nature at various times of day, seasons, and climate serve as her source of inspiration. She loves to paint the beautiful light in the captivating landscapes that she finds in metro west Boston, where she lives, and in Québec, her ancestral home.

Her background in fine arts, language and music enriches her sensitivity as an artist. A Diploma graduate from the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, she also has a B.A. with French major, music and art minors from Rivier College. Her professional work includes a career in teaching art, graphic design and in practicing fine arts as a painter. She has sixteen years experience as a certified teacher and art specialist at the Museum of Fine Arts, the Pilot School, l'École Bilingue and the French Association of Cambridge, Nashua and the Framingham Public Schools, Montrose School and others. Her work in graphic design involved creating artwork for Stone and Webster and Quincy Market. Her art organization experience includes the National Museum of Women in the Arts and the Rockport Art Association. She is currently an artist member of the Concord Art Association, the Wellesley Society of Artists, the Needham Art Association and a past president.

The artist has exhibited her award winning oil paintings, pastels and drawings in numerous solo and juried exhibits and group shows in galleries, museums, colleges, libraries, banks and corporations. Her art has been displayed in solo exhibits at the Parker Gallery of the James McNeill Whistler Museum in Lowell, the Copley Plaza in Boston, South Shore Bank and Middlesex Savings Bank in metro west, Market Street Associates in Brighton, the Village Gallery in Needham, the Swain Gallery in Dover, Needham Open Studios, the Dover Town Library, the French Library Alliance Française of Boston, the Musée Mauvide-Genest in Québec and the Loring Coleman Gallery at the Concord Art Association. Some of the juried exhibit locations in which her work was accepted and shown include the Zullo Gallery in Medfield, the Concord Art Association, the Boston Museum School and Stone and Webster in Boston. The group exhibit areas where she has shown her art include the Wellesley Free Library, Wellesley Community Center, the R.L. Gallery and Art Emporium Gallery in Needham, the Juliani Gallery and Babson College in Wellesley.

Being native francophone with links to Québec and France, she has associations in the francophone community through family, friends, and institutions of art, culture, and education. As a francophone artist, she displayed her work in a duo-solo invitational exhibit sponsored by La Fédération Féminine Franco-Américaine at the Copley Plaza, Boston. She illustrated and designed "Thanatopsis, Poème par William Cullen Bryant, Version Française de Rosaire Dion-Lévesque." At l'École Bilingue and the French Association of Cambrdige she taught an art workshop for youth. Also, she was a guest artist in a televised Cultural Francophone Program presented by Richard Santerre, a French professor at Boston College.

Art Exhibits in Québec in which the artist has participated include the following: from June 30th to July 13th, 2008, she gave a solo exhibit of her plein air paintings at Le Musée Mauvide-Genest, Saint Jean, Île d'Orléans. In the summer of 2008, she displayed paintings at l'Atelier Aux Trois Portes, Saint Jean, Île d'Orléans.

In the United States, the artist displayed her art in a solo exhibit at the Coleman Gallery in Concord, Massachusetts from July 1st through August 14th, 2008. Her work was juried and selected for the exhibit by the Concord Art Association.
